Ray reports to October 30th from this initiative we have collected **C\$19,705** and **US\$4,915** from over 66 Georgians in the USA and Canada. Also with the huge success of our Summer Ball we were able to send **C\$20,000** this year to help with the school deficit and a further **C\$5000** to the Building Fund. These are tough economic times and we appreciate the effort made by so many. God bless you all for your support. To those who have not given as yet- don't be left out. The funds are still needed. We still have a long way to go.




