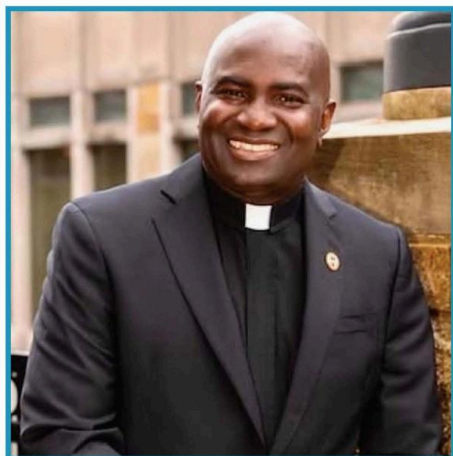

Rev. Michael Davidson S.J. Receives Honour for Service to Underrepresented Youth

The Diocese of Brooklyn, NY, has honoured Fr. Michael Davidson S.J. for his work with students of colour and underrepresented groups. Fr. Davidson will be among the honourees for the 2025 Gala of the Vicariate of Black Catholic Concerns Youth Leadership Ambassador Program.

Fr. Michael serves as Director of the Montserrat Coalition at Boston College, where he began his career as a resident campus minister in 2012. Founded in 2008, the Montserrat Coalition serves students with the highest levels of financial need, providing access to retreats, sporting and theatre events, service programs, and independent study, while also aiding in their academic, social, and spiritual formation.

Fr. Michael is passionate about education of youth at both the secondary and tertiary levels. He served as Director of the Thea Bowman AHANA and Intercultural Centre, he is Board Member of Boston College High School, Catholic Memorial High School and, in Jamaica, of Campion College of the Archdiocese of Kingston. As a Jesuit scholastic, he was Dean of Discipline at St. George's College (2004-06) and ordained to the priesthood at Holy Trinity Cathedral, Kingston, Jamaica in 2010. Fr. Michael is a former Spiritual Director of the STGC Alumni Association in Ontario and stays closely in touch with graduates of St. George's College.

Fr. Michael is known as a priest of and for the people and a passionate promoter of diversity and equity.
